

Vowel teams



In many words, you see two vowels together:

ǎim slěěp

We call some \checkmark combos "vowel teams." They are teams because they make one long sound together. Here are some vowel teams:

ai ee oa ue ay ea

Most times, the first vowel is long (says its name) and the **second** vowel is silent -you don't hear it.



Here are some vowel team words to read:

brain groan feel sway glue


