## Noun suffixes



**Suffixes** are word parts that come at the end of words, like the -ment in prepayment.

**Suffixes** can change the meaning of the base word. The suffix **-er/-or** can turn a verb (an action word) into a noun (a person or thing).

Verb		Noun
sing	→	singer
write	→	writer
protest	→	protestor
advise	→	advisor

suggest $\rightarrow$	suggestion
predict $\rightarrow$	predic <b>tion</b>
