## The igh ietter comioo

In vowel teams, two letters combine to make a long vowel sound.
The vowel team oa makes the long vowel sound $\overline{\mathbf{o}}$.
The vowel team ie makes the long vowel sound $\mathbf{i}$.

Vowel teams have a letter we hear plus a silent letter.
Another kind of letter combo has a vowel and two consonants:

## igh

The vowel i makes a long sound and the consonants gh are silent.
Here are some examples:
