## History of the World Trade Center

The World Trade Center was planned to include the tallest buildings in the world. The center would be located in lower <u>Manhattan</u>, New York. The World Trade Center would face New York harbor. The Statue of <u>Liberty</u> was close by. New office space would attract new business to New York.

A famous <u>architect</u>, Minoru Yamasaki, planned two twin towers. Inside the towers, the windows were tall and narrow, only 18 inches wide. People say that <u>Yamasaki</u> was scared of heights. He planned narrow windows to make people feel safer up high.

Fifty thousand people worked in the towers. Around the towers were five smaller buildings and a <u>plaza</u>. You could eat dinner, get your hair cut, and catch the subway, all inside the complex. A train station <u>connected</u> the center with New Jersey.

The towers took seven years to finish and cost almost a billion dollars. The twin towers formed part of the famous New York skyline. They were a symbol of New York and of American power.

You may not know that <u>terrorists</u> first tried to blow up the center in 1993. A bomb was left in a van in a garage under the complex. A huge fire spread up the North Tower. Office workers had to walk downstairs in the dark and smoke. Six people were killed and more than one thousand were hurt.

For years after September 11, 2001, a giant hole was all that was left. People called the site Ground Zero. Over the next couple of years, construction <u>started</u> to rebuild the World Trade Center.
