Using the table of contents

to preview nonfiction

Nonfiction books are set up to give us new information. Before reading a nonfiction book, you often preview. When you preview, you ask, "What can I learn about?" "Where can I find different kinds of facts in this book?"

 \rightarrow One way to preview a book is with the table of contents.

- The table of contents is found on one of the first pages of the book.
- The table of contents lists the chapter numbers and page numbers where you can find each chapter.
