## Syliabies and voweis

Syllables are chunks of sound.


If you say these words out loud you will hear the chunks or beats of sound:

tower - arrest - beneath

October - memory - cathedral

Syllables have a vowel sound. The vowels are a, e, i, o, u or sometimes y.

## How to find syllables:

1. You can try saying the word and clapping the number of beats you hear in the word.

2. You can look at the word and count the number of vowels. But remember: ploummere $\stackrel{v}{\text { e }}$ d 3

- Don't count the silent vowel e at the end of words.


- Don't count the second vowel in vowel combos like oo, ea, or ee.
