
Syliables and vowels

Syllables are chunks of sound.





If you say these words out loud you will hear the chunks or beats of sound:

man - sky - rope	These words have 1 syllable
tower - arrest - beneath	← These words have 2 syllables
October - memory - cathedral	← These words have 3 syllables

Syllables have a **vowel** sound. The vowels are a, e, i, o, u or sometimes y.

Circle the vowels in this word:

How to find syllables:

- 1. You can try saying the word and clapping the number of beats you hear in the word.
- 2. You can look at the word and count the number of vowels. But remember:
 - Don't count the **silent vowel e** at the end of words.
 - Don't count the **second vowel** in vowel combos like oo, ea, or ee.
