

Chunking long words

How do we read VC CV words?

We know to chunk the words between the middle consonants.

In words with VC CV pattern, the first syllable has a short vowel sound.

The short vowel sound is what we hear in the words hat, pet, mitt, job, and cut.

The second syllable can have a long or short vowel sound. Mark the vowels in these VC CV words as long $\bar{}$ or short $\tilde{}$.
