In 1990, Iraq invaded Kuwait, another oil-rich nation. The invasion was led by Iraq's89president, Saddam Hussein. His goal was to take over Kuwait's oil supply. The U.S.103responded quickly. Our leaders demanded that Saddam pull back. He refused. We115invaded. Our leaders promised to free the Kuwaiti people. Faced with much stronger128forces, the Iraqis retreated. In seven months, the Gulf War was over.140

The 1990 Gulf War ended quickly but left anger on both sides. The U.S. suspected155Saddam was planning more violence. Saddam would not let inspectors check for illegal168weapons. In response, the U.S. blocked supplies and aid from entering Iraq. This enraged182Saddam. He said outsiders were trying to control his country.192

Ten years later, the 9/11 attacks raised new fears about Iraq. President Bush said Saddam208was connected to the 9/11 terrorists. He also warned that Saddam was building dangerous223weapons. What if Saddam gave poison gas to terrorists? Or a nuclear bomb? These237fears helped spark a new war in 2003.245
